

GOVERNOR'S PROCLAMATION



WHEREAS, the state of Wyoming has not established a state memorial designated to recognize and to honor the Wyoming men and women who served and sacrificed for our country during and since the Korean War, and

WHEREAS, Chapter 307 of the Korean War Veterans Association, headquartered in Cody, Wyoming has undertaken a project to erect an appropriate memorial to honor all who served in the Korean War and to individually memorialize each of the Wyoming men who gave their lives during this war, and

WHEREAS, The City of Cody has provided an appropriate setting for this memorial where it will be co-located with the Wyoming Vietnam Memorial and the City of Cody has agreed to maintain and secure the site, and

WHEREAS, Chapter 307 of the Korean War Veterans Association has commenced the site preparation, design and funding for this memorial, and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper, that the Wyoming citizens who served and sacrificed with their service in Korea be honored and memorialized.

NOW, THEREFORE, I DAVE FREUDENTHAL, Governor of the State of Wyoming, hereby proclaim the aforementioned memorial as

THE STATE KOREAN WAR MEMORIAL

in Wyoming, and ask our citizens to respect this memorial in recognition and acknowledgement of the sacrifice of Wyoming's Korean War Veterans.
